## Export/Import into Grades in Canvas

Anytime you have grades that need to be imported (maybe from textbook software), you can easily do this in Canvas. The best way is to export the grades area in Canvas as a csv, make the changes and add the grades, and then import the csv into the gradebook in Canvas.

Export:
Go to the Grades area of your canvas course. Choose Actions at the top left area of the page, and select Export.

This will start a download after a moment, go to your downloads area and open the CSV file. You can see the student name on the left, the name of the assignment at the top row, and how many points on the $3^{\text {rd }}$ row:


From here you can add a column and input how many points the student gets. Right click on a column and choose "Insert Column". This will create a blank column where you can name the assignment, assign the points possible, and manually enter the student's points.


Save the CSV and close it.
Import:
Go to the Canvas Grades area, click Actions, and click Import.


This will get you to the upload screen where you click Choose File and select the CSV file you just saved.

This will bring you to this page, making sure you see that an assignment was added. Click Choose assignment. NOTE: If the CSV file has a lot of data (i.e. you have a large class size), then it will take a little bit of time for this page to load and verify all the new assignments you added in the CSV.
