A&M ECON Only Exchange: Erasmus School of Economics (Netherlands)

Deadlines to Apply are March I for Fall 2025 and Aug I5 for Spring 2026

OVERVIEW

Founded in 1913, the Erasmus School of Economics (ESE) is one of the leading economics schools within Europe and the world. With Nobel Prize winning professors, the School of Economics is ranked 5th best in Europe and 22nd in the world in economics and business (2024). The school is located in Rotterdam, the second largest city in The Netherlands, which is known for its unique modern architecture, and as one of the most diverse cities in The Netherlands. While only 40 minutes from Amsterdam by high speed rail, Rotterdam offers a vibrant city experience with cultural events, festivals, sports, and other activities. Meanwhile, the rest of Europe is within easy reach for your weekend adventures.

ELIGIBILITY

- This exchange program is limited to students in the Department of Economics
- Have a minimum TAMU GPA of 3.3
- Be a TAMU student for at least one semester prior to application
- Attend TAMU for at least one full semester after the exchange
- Have a minimum Junior classification by the beginning of exchange; can be a Sophomore at the time of application
- All students must be in <u>Good Academic</u>
 <u>Standing</u> and <u>Good Conduct Standing</u> with
 Texas A&M University to participate in
 education abroad programs.

COURSEWORK

The College of Arts and Sciences has a course database with dozens of pre-approved course options for this exchange program. Course descriptions at Erasmus may be found on courses.eur.nl. Students are advised to take on a study workload of 24 ECTS, which is equivalent to 12 TAMU credit hours.
